## PUCRS

The Pontifícia Universidade Católica do Rio Grande do Sul (PUCRS), anchored in the solid educational tradition of the Marist brothers, is committed to responding to the needs of society in order to build a better future. PUCRS is keen to generate innovation and development, in all of their dimensions - social, environmental, cultural, economic and scientific -, through its strategic positioning. It acknowledges the value of people, whose comprehensive development is, above all, what the institution is here for.

## History and Structure

The institution's cornerstone was the Undergraduate Degree in Business Administration and Finance, established in March 1931. It was recognized as a university on November 9,

1948. As a private non-profit entity, PUCRS has a legal bond with its supporter, União Brasileira de Educação e Assistência - UBEA, a legal entity governed by private law. It has been recognized as a Private Non-Profit Higher Education Institution (ICES) by Directive No. 632, dated Oct 30, 2014.

It is a Catholic confessional institution guided by the educational tradition of the Marist Brothers, having the Archbishop of Porto Alegre as its Chancellor. The title of Pontifical, granted on November 1<sup>st</sup>, 1950, by Pope Pius XII, marks its union and filial devotion to the Holy See. It comprises its Main Campus, in Porto Alegre, the capital of Rio Grande do Sul, and a second unit of the Science and Technology Park (Tecnopuc) in Viamão, in the Greater Metropolitan Area.

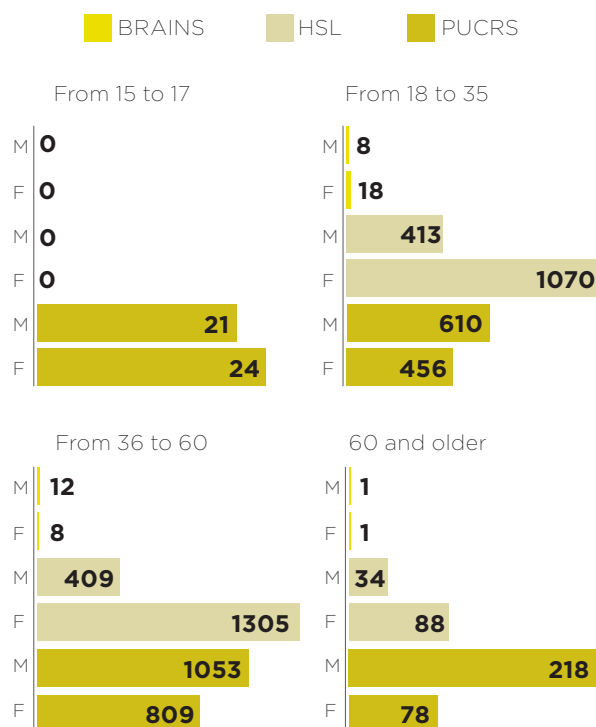
### Internal audience

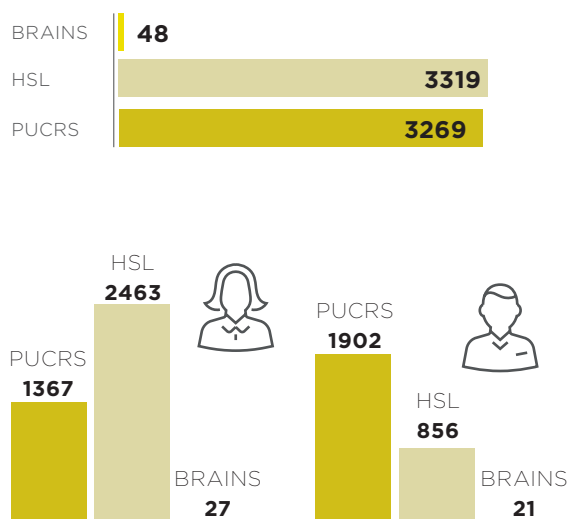

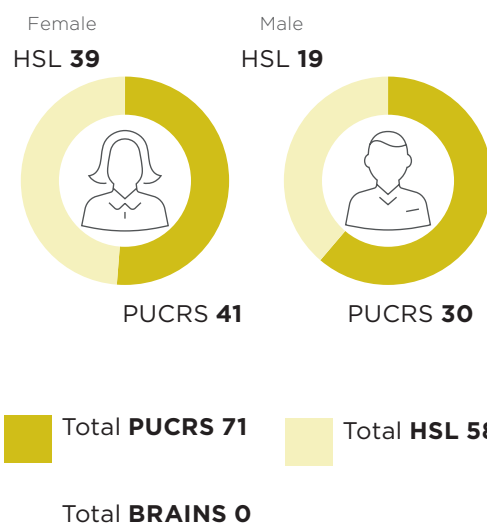

## COMMUNICATION, ENGAGEMENT AND RELATIONSHIP WITH SOCIETY

One of the strategic goals stated in PUCRS' Strategic Plan 2016-2022 is to "Contribute to social, environmental, cultural and economic development with the involvement of Universities, Businesses, Government and Society". This goal is in close connection with the increasingly effective insertion of the University into the social tissue of the community it belongs, in an attempt to interact more and cooperate with the actions involving the other relevant actors in the quadruple propeller (University - Businesses - Government - Society). These efforts are intended to consolidate the leading role to be played by the region in order to improve the quality of life of the community.

### Representation in Public and Private Agencies

The university's faculty, researchers and staff represent the institution in public and private agencies (agencies, associations, boards, councils, foundations, among others), at the local, national and international levels, as a means to relate to society. In 2017, the university was represented in 388 different occasions.

### Institutional publications

The four major institutional publications are made available to the public on the Portal PUCRS. From 2017 on, *Revista PUCRS* will count on 3 yearly issues, each of which being 72-page long. This magazine features major events and innovative actions in an effort to advance discussions on issues that mobilize society and the academia.

An unabridged version of the *Social Report* has been published online since 2003. It contains information about the actions that the University and São Lucas Hospital have been carrying out with their audiences. Brains actions have been featured since 2016.

*PUCRS Magazine*, an abridged international version of *Revista PUCRS*, had its first bilingual - Spanish / English - issue published in Nov 2017 in an attempt to bring the institution closer to Latin America.

The *Catalog of Research* gets an updated version every three years and features the high-impact scientific investigations carried out at the University.

## UNDERGRADUATE SCENARIO

### PUCRS 360°

In 2017, the University launched PUCRS 360°, a movement of transformation. One of the highlights of this movement is the fact that undergraduate students can now choose whichever course they want to take in order to bring their career to a higher level of quality in view of their interests. This is one of the actions PUCRS has endeavored to undertake in order to respond to the needs of the different youth and students it hopes to open its doors to.

In this new perspective, students will choose the courses they want to take in order to complete a minor as well as specific courses in the area of their chosen major. All of that will be permeated by intense actions of human development. This

gives students more autonomy and flexibility in their learning process.

## Institutional Evaluation

In line with the National System of Evaluation of Higher Education (SINAES), PUCRS develops self-evaluation processes with the internal community and is evaluated by the Anísio Teixeira National Institute for Educational Studies and Research (INEP/Ministry of Education).

The internal evaluation is carried out by Assessment Committees (CPA/CTA), and its results provide insights for the continuous improvement of teaching, research and extension activities.

As for the external evaluation, results published by the INEP/MEC in 2017 deserve special attention. In the General Index of Courses

(IGC), PUCRS received grade 4, which places it as the fourth best private university in Brazil. The IGC is an indicator of quality of higher education institutions that looks at the quality of undergraduate and graduate programs (Master's and Doctoral programs).

## ENADE on PUCRS Portal

The National Examination of Students' Performance (ENADE) is one of the methods employed by the Ministry of Education to assess the quality of education of the higher education institutions in the country.

## GRADUATE SCENARIO

---

### A national reference according to the Ministry of Education

PUCRS offers 24 Graduate-level programs (Master's and Doctorate) recommended by the Brazilian Federal Agency for Support and Evaluation of Higher Education (Capes/MEC). The University was awarded grade 5.36 and is being recognized for having the best Graduate programs in the Country, according to the evaluation conducted by Capes / MEC for the period 2013 - 2016. Today, 11 PUCRS programs have been awarded grades 6 and 7, which place them at the level of international excellence. 10 others have been awarded grade 5, which place them at the level of national excellence, and three other programs have earned grade 4.

### Internal Evaluation of Graduate and Certificate Programs

In response to the needs of the National System of Evaluation of Higher Education (SINAES), PUCRS evaluates its Master's and Doctoral Programs every two years. Last time they were evaluated, in 2017, the level of satisfaction of students was 4.3, which was above the University's initial expectations (4.0).

The Certificate programs are evaluated every semester. The first time this evaluation took place was in 2015. Results are evaluated by the head coordinators and by the coordinator of each Certificate program. In 2017, these results were discussed and a set of actions was set.

### IDEAR - Institute for Research and Development

Idear deals with entrepreneurship as a competence that involves the mobilization of knowledge, abilities and attitudes, the exercise of creativity, critical thinking and the exercise of autonomy. In order to raise awareness of its team for an entrepreneurial attitude, every year Idear offers the elective course *Projeto Desafios: Inovação and Impacto Social* (**Challenges: Innovation and Social Impact**) for all undergraduate students of PUCRS. The insights gained in this course will be applied both in the academia and in the community. It also promotes lectures, workshops, seminars, practicum activities, chats, advising services and the *Torneio Empreendedor*.

At the end of Pré-Grad, students will have the chance to apply for the Bolsa de Iniciação Científica Júnior (Junior Undergraduate Research Scholarship) to develop activities in research groups in the graduate programs of PUCRS.

## STUDENT PLACEMENT IN THE JOB MARKET

The Careers Office is a space dedicated to undergraduate and graduate students, and alumni from PUCRS as well as the external community. Its purpose is to guide these students in their career planning, job placement and assist them in developing the skills needed in the job market. It is also intended to strengthen the ties between students of PUCRS and the business world. Additionally, it aims at building a career plan that encompasses the personal and professional

## INTERNATIONALIZATION

---

PUCRS has set out that one of the pillars of the Strategic Plan in effect until 2022 will be the promotion of Internationalization and Interculturality. One of the goals of this pillar is to develop international partnerships with institutions. This is in close connection with the identification and consolidation of strategic international partnerships at the institutional level, in critical areas for the University's positioning and vision of future. The areas identified include: companies, represented by the Science and Technology Park (Tecnopuc); research and interdisciplinary training, represented by the academic units; and businesses, represented by the Business School.

As for the academic realm, six courses in English are offered at the Master's and Doctoral levels. The initiative is intended to gradually increase the number of courses to be offered to Brazilian and international students at the graduate-level.

## EDUCATION-EXTENSION INTEGRATION

PUCRS has a PET group consisting of 63 students. This program is advised by a faculty member. ## Ubea Social Assistance / PUCRS

Today, the Social Assistance Policy of the União Brasileira de Educação e Assistência – Ubea is carried out at the Pontifícia Universidade Católica do Rio Grande do Sul (PUCRS), through the Office of the Vice President for Extension and Community Affairs (Proex). ## Student Representation

The University recognizes the importance of student representation and policies as opportunities for learning and for the exercise of civic consciousness and comprehensive education. Established agreements provide the necessary funding for overseeing and supporting the activities. Students are also provided with spaces for cultural, social and sports actions, and the necessary actions for the election of the entities' leaders.

The 22 Student Centers and Academic Unions as well as the Central Student Directorate (DCE), all follow their own bylaws and representation in the University Council and the Board of each School. In 2017, 100 students served as leaders in the unions.

## Vila Fátima University Extension Center

Located in the Bom Jesus Area, in Porto Alegre, the Vila Fátima University Extension Center is a health station that features medical doctors, nurses and orderlies. The fact of the Center being part of PUCRS makes it possible for a large number of undergraduate and graduate students to engage in activities every year, offering various resources to the community, in the area of social assistance and development, legal counseling, education and health.

In 2017, eight programs of PUCRS developed activities at the Center. Overall, there were 29,313 walk-ins and 212 counseling and support meetings were offered. The Program for Assistance of Bedridden Patients provided assistance to 597 patients in their homes.

PUCRS is firmly engaged in the Marist actions of volunteering. It is educational in nature as it investigates and questions the sources of social inequalities. It is intended to understand, decode and create alternatives in view of the contexts of territorial and existential peripheries.

In 2017, 243 people took part in systematic activities. A total of 8,000 people have been benefited from these volunteering actions. Hence, giving the chance for people living different realities and different communities, and also other entities, to interact more in Marist areas is a good opportunity that the project offers as it is intent on providing comprehensive development as well as personal and social transformation.

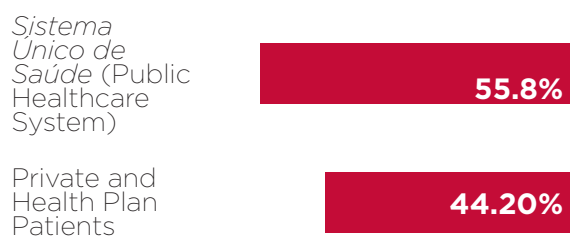

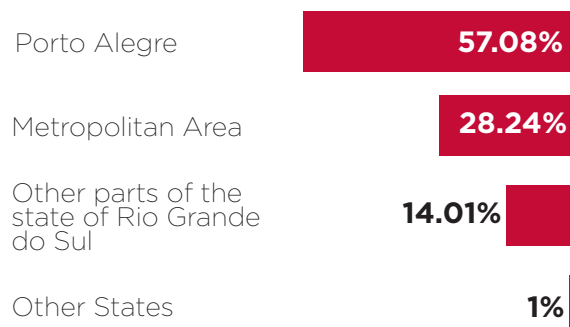

## BRAINS-RS SPECIAL FEATURES

### *Projeto Superidosos* (Superagers)

*Superidosos*, one of the projects developed and carried out at Brains-RS, is the first study in Brazil that is intended to understand the operation of the brain of the elderly who appear to be immune to aging. Coordinated by professor Dr Jaderson Costa da Costa, this study intends to show the anatomic and functional traits that are unique to this group of elderly individuals. This research is intended to assist in the early diagnosis and prevention strategies of Alzheimer's.

The relevance of the topic can be attested in numbers. According to a recent study conducted by the Brazilian Institute of Geography and Statistics (IBGE), the country now has 3,5 individuals at this age range and is expected to reach 19 million in 2060. Additionally, the number of patients suffering from Alzheimer's is at an exponential growth, as it affects around 1/3 of all elderly individuals above the age of 85.

When setting the pillars of its strategic positioning, PUCRS has assumed the commitment to being a University that produces innovation as well as social, environmental, cultural and economic development for the benefit of society. This endorses the actions that have been promoted for years - as well as new initiatives - in the sense of preserving the environment and implementing institutional and educational projects aimed at respecting and ensuring the sustainable use of natural resources.

The materialization of the activities geared towards the environment can be attested as some of

them have been added to undergraduate curricula. The course on Socioenvironmental Studies, of the School of Humanities' Pedagogy Program, is one of such examples. The Environmental Management Committee and Project USE - Sustainable Energy Use are other examples.

Another example of that is the Pró-Mata Center for Environmental Research and Conservation, in the city of São Francisco de Paula (RS). Teaching, research and extension activities are offered in support of the Institute for the Environment.
